- Carry out a visual check to make sure that all lights and reflectors are present, clean, secure and operational.
- Carry out a visual check on all tyres use a tread depth gauge to measure.
- Carry out a visual check on all wheel fixings (wheel nuts), checking indicators.
- Carry out an operational check on windscreen washer and wiper operation, including wiper blade condition.
- Carry out a visual check on mirrors to make sure that all are present, clean and secure.
